This matter came for hearing on May 5, 2026, before Cheryl Wolff, a hearing officer duly appointed by the Director of the Nebraska Department of Insurance. The Nebraska Department of Insurance (“Department”) was represented by its counsel, Michael Anderson. Marvin Schneider (“Respondent”) was not present and was not represented by counsel. The proceedings were recorded by Shelly Storie, a licensed Notary Public. The Department presented evidence at the hearing, and the matter was taken under advisement. The hearing officer makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Recommended Order:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Department is the agency of the State of Nebraska charged with licensing Insurance Producers.
2. Respondent currently holds a resident insurance producer’s license in the State of Nebraska. Respondent’s registered residence, business, and mailing address with the Nebraska Department of Insurance is 3609 S 18TH ST, LINCOLN, Nebraska 68502, and his registered email address is SCHNEIDERMARVIN@outlook.com. (See Ex. 1, Attachment 1).

3. On October 9, 2025, the Respondent applied for a resident license in the State of Nebraska. On this application, Respondent responded “No” to questions 1A and 1B, which asks if the Respondent has been charged with or convicted of any misdemeanors or felonies. (Ex. 1, Attachment 2)
4. On December 5, 2025, a search on the Nebraska Judicial Branch’s statewide trial case management system known as JUSTICE (Judicial User System to Increase Court Effectiveness), showing the Respondent had prior convictions as follows:
 - a. Attempt of a class 1C/1D/2 felony, which is a class 3 felony out of Clay County, Nebraska for an offense that occurred on or about October 1, 1993. As a result of this conviction, Respondent appears on the Nebraska Sex Offender Registry. (Ex. 1, Attachment 3).
 - b. Attempt of a class 3A or Class 4 felony, a class 1 misdemeanor out of Adams County, Nebraska, for an offense dated on or about August 25, 2014. (Ex. 1, Attachment 3).
 - c. Obstruct government operations, a class 1 misdemeanor out of Webster County, Nebraska, for an offense dated on or about July 1, 2024. (Ex. 1, Attachment 3).
5. On December 5, 2025, the Petitioner’s office indicated they sent a letter by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the address on file for the Respondent, requesting a written statement regarding the convictions. (Ex. 1, Attachment 4)
6. On or about December 29, 2025, the letter was returned to the Petitioner’s office marked “RETURN TO SENDER, VACANT, UNABLE TO FORWARD”. (Ex. 1, Attachment 5).
7. On or about January 14, 2026, an email was sent to the email address on file for the Respondent, reiterating the previous request. No response was received to that request. (Ex. 1, Attachment 6 and Ex. 1).

8. On or about March 11, 2026, the Petition and Notice of Hearing were served upon Respondent by mailing the same to the registered address, by certified mail, return receipt requested, and via regular U.S. mail. A copy was also sent via electronic mail to the Respondent's registered email address. (Ex. 2).
9. On or about March 11, 2026, the Department received a "DELIVERED" message from the electronic mail sent to the Respondent. (Ex 2, Attachment 1).
10. On or about March 31, 2026, the letter and Domestic Return Receipt Card were returned by the U.S. Postal Service to the Department, marked "RETURN TO SENDER, ATTEMPTED – NOT KNOWN, UNABLE TO FORWARD". As of May 5, 2026, the letter sent regular U.S. mail had not been returned to the Department. (Ex. 2, Attachment 1, and Ex. 2).

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Department has broad jurisdiction, control, and discretion over the licensing of insurance producers in the State of Nebraska pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 44-101.01 and 44-4047 et seq.
2. The Department has personal jurisdiction over Respondent.
3. Pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 44-4059, provides that the Director may refuse to issue or renew an insurance producer's license for several reasons including: ... (b) Violating any insurance law or violating any rule, regulation, subpoena, or order of the director or of another state's insurance commissioner or director; . . . (f) Having been convicted of a felony or a Class I, II, or III misdemeanor.
4. Respondent violated Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 44-4059(1)(b) and (f) as a result of the conduct found in paragraphs 4 through 7 in the Findings of Fact and as evidenced by the relevant exhibits received.

12. The department is responsible for providing accurate financial information to management.

13. It also plays a key role in budgeting and financial planning.

14. The accounting department works closely with other departments to ensure the accuracy of the data.

15. The fifth part of the document provides a summary of the key findings.

16. The overall financial performance of the company is satisfactory.

17. However, there are some areas that need further attention.

18. These include improving the accuracy of the records and streamlining the accounting process.

19. The sixth part of the document provides recommendations for improvement.

20. It is recommended that the company implement the following measures:

21. - Strengthen internal controls to prevent errors and fraud.

22. - Invest in training for the accounting staff to improve their skills.

23. - Regularly update the accounting system to incorporate the latest software.

24. - Conduct regular audits to ensure the accuracy of the records.

25. The seventh part of the document provides a conclusion.

26. The accounting department is a vital part of the company's success.

DISCUSSION

At the hearing, the Department presented sufficient evidence of proper service of notice of these proceedings upon Respondent. The Department served Respondent via certified mail, return receipt requested and regular U.S. mail to the Respondent's registered address. The Department also served the Respondent via electronic mail and received confirmation that the email was delivered to the Respondent's registered email address. Based upon the evidence of record, the Department's service of the petition and notice of hearing upon Respondent at the addresses of record was sufficient and jurisdiction over the actions of the Respondent in this matter has been established.

The uncontested evidence shows that Respondent misrepresented his past criminal misdemeanor convictions on his licensing application to obtain a license. The Respondent has numerous misdemeanor convictions in Nebraska and has offered no explanation of the convictions nor for the omissions on his application.


These actions constitute a violation of Neb. Rev. Stat. § 44-4059(1)(b) and (f).

RECOMMENDED ORDER

Based on the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, it is recommended that Respondent's resident producer's license be revoked. The Nebraska Department of Insurance shall retain jurisdiction of this matter for the purpose of enabling Respondent or the Department of Insurance to make application for such orders as may be necessary.
