This matter came up for hearing on June 23, 2026, before Megan VanAusdall, a hearing officer duly appointed by the Director of the Nebraska Department of Insurance. The Nebraska Department of Insurance (“Department”) was represented by its counsel, Michael W. Anderson. Jaime Skunza, (“Respondent”) did not appear and was not represented by counsel. The proceedings were recorded by Shelly Storie, a licensed Notary Public. The Department offered Exhibits 1 and 2 at the hearing, which were received without objection. The Respondent did not offer any exhibits. After the conclusion of evidence, the matter was taken under advisement. The hearing officer makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Recommended Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Department is the agency of the State of Nebraska charged with licensing insurance producers.
1. Jaime Skunza is a resident insurance producer in this state, licensed under a National Producer Number (“NPN”) of 20582515. Respondent’s license has a first active date of January 25, 2023, and an expiration date of October 31, 2026. Respondent’s residential and mailing address on file with the Department is 16404 FLORENCE CHAPEL PIKE, CIRCLEVILLE, OHIO 43113-9553, and her business address on file is 251 W 30th St, #9W, NEW YORK, NEW YORK 10001. Respondent’s registered business email

address on file is JAIME.@PUMPKIN.CARE, and her personal email address is on file as JSKUNZA98@GMAIL.COM. (Ex. 1, Attachment 1)

2. On May 1, 2025, Petitioner's office, through employee Kevin Schlautman ("Schlautman"), head of the licensing division, received a NAIC Alert indicating that New York had revoked Respondent's non-resident insurance producer license in that state. (Ex 1, Attachment 2)
3. A subsequent search of the RIRS database revealed that Respondent's resident license in her resident state of Ohio had expired, effective October 31, 2024. The search further found that Respondent had administrative actions taken against her which revoked her non-resident insurance license in the states of Idaho, Mississippi, New York, with effective dates as follows:
 - a. Idaho – Effective August 27, 2025;
 - b. Mississippi - Effective July 21, 2025;
 - c. New York - Effective March 21, 2025;and,
 - d. Kansas - Respondent's license was denied on both April 7, 2023, and August 25, 2023, with the reason given as "Criminal Record/History."

5. A review of Respondent's record showed that she did provide the required notice to the Department of the administrative actions referenced above from New York, Kansas, and Idaho, she did not provide notice to the Department of the administrative action from Mississippi in the time period set under statute. (Ex 1)
6. On or about May 6, 2026, Shelly Storie ("Storie"), an employee of the Department's Legal Division, served a copy of the Petition and Notice of Hearing upon Respondent by mailing the same to Respondent's registered business, mailing and residential addresses, at 16404 FLORENCE CHAPEL PIKE, CIRCLEVILLE, OH 43113-9553, and to 251 W 30th STREET, #9W, NEW YORK, NY 10001, by certified mail, return receipt requested, via regular mail, and by sending a digital copy as an attachment to an email addressed to Respondent's email addresses on file, JAIME@PUMPKIN.CARE, AND JSKUNZA98@GMAIL.COM. (Ex. 2)

7. On or about May 28, 2026, the letter and associated certified mail return receipt sent to Respondent's address in New York was returned by USPS marked "RETURN TO SENDER, UNCLAIMED, UNABLE TO FORWARD." (Ex. 2, Attachment 1)

8. On or about June 5, 2026, the letter and associated certified mail return receipt sent to Respondent's address in Ohio, was returned by USPS marked "RETURN TO SENDER, UNCLAIMED, UNABLE TO FORWARD." (Ex. 2, Attachment 2)

9. As of June 23, 2026, Respondent has not provided a response to any attempted contacts by the Department. (Ex. 2)

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Department has broad jurisdiction, control, and discretion over the licensing of insurance producers and licensed insurance agencies in the State of Nebraska pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 44-101.01 and 44-4047 to 40-4069.

2. The Department has personal jurisdiction over Respondent.

3. Pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §§44-4059(1), the director may suspend, revoke, or refuse to issue or renew an insurance producer's license or may levy an administrative fine if it is found that the producer has violated any insurance law.

4. Respondent violated Neb. Rev. Stat. §44-4059(1)(b) as a result of the conduct found in the Findings of Fact and as evidenced by the relevant exhibits received.

5. Respondent violated Neb. Rev. Stat. §44-4059(1)(h) as a result of the conduct found in the Findings of Fact and as evidenced by the relevant exhibits received.

6. Respondent violated Neb. Rev. Stat. §44-4059(1)(o) as a result of the conduct found in the Findings of Fact and as evidenced by the relevant exhibits received.

DISCUSSION

At the hearing, the Department presented sufficient evidence of proper service of notice of these proceedings upon Respondent. The Department served Respondent via certified mail, return receipt requested and regular U.S. mail to the Respondent's registered addresses. The Department also provided a Domestic Return Receipt for the notice filings, which, along with the tracking information also provided, confirmation of delivery to the Respondent. Based upon the evidence of record, the Department's service of the petition and notice of hearing upon Respondent at her

business, residential, and mailing addresses of record were sufficient and jurisdiction over the actions of the Respondent in this matter has been established.

The uncontested evidence shows that Respondent failed to disclose an administrative action taken against her license in another state and failed to maintain a valid insurance license in her resident state. Then, after Respondent received an inquiry letter from the Department, Respondent failed to provide a response.

These actions constitute a violation of Neb. Rev. Stat. § 44-4059(1)(b), (h), and (o).

RECOMMENDED ORDER

Based on the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, it is recommended that Respondent's non-resident insurance producer's license be revoked. The Nebraska Department of Insurance shall retain jurisdiction of this matter for the purpose of enabling Respondent or the Department of Insurance to make application for such orders as may be necessary.
