Pursuant to your instruction and authorizations, and in accordance with statutory requirements, an examination has been conducted of the financial condition and business affairs of:

MEDICARE ADVANTAGE INSURANCE COMPANY OF OMAHA 3300 Mutual of Omaha Plaza Omaha, Nebraska 68175

(hereinafter also referred to as the "Company"), and the report of such examination is respectfully presented herein.

INTRODUCTION

The State of Nebraska last examined the Company as of December 31, 2018. The current financial condition examination covers the intervening period to, and includes the close of business on December 31, 2022 and such subsequent events and transactions as were considered pertinent to this report. The States of Nebraska and New York participated in this examination and assisted in the preparation of this report.

The same examination staff conducted concurrent financial condition examinations of the Company's ultimate parent, Mutual of Omaha Insurance Company (Mutual), and its subsidiaries, Companion Life Insurance Company, Mutual of Omaha Medicare Advantage Company, Omaha Health Insurance Company, Omaha Insurance Company, Omaha Reinsurance Company, Omaha

Supplemental Insurance Company, United of Omaha Life Insurance Company (United), and United World Life Insurance Company.

SCOPE OF EXAMINATION

The examination was conducted pursuant to and in accordance with both the NAIC Financial Condition Examiners Handbook (Handbook) and Section §44-5904(1) of the Nebraska Insurance Statutes. The Handbook requires that examiners plan and perform the examination to evaluate the financial condition and identify prospective risks of the Company by obtaining information about the Company including but not limited to: corporate governance, identifying and assessing inherent risks within the Company, and evaluating system controls and procedures used to mitigate those risks. The examination also includes assessing the principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation and management's compliance with Statutory Accounting Principles and Annual Statement Instructions, when applicable to domestic state regulations.

The examination was completed under coordination of the holding company group approach with the Nebraska Department of Insurance as the coordinating state and the New York Department of Financial Services serving as the participating state. The companies examined under this approach benefit to a large degree from common management, systems and processes, and internal control and risk management functions that are administered at the consolidated or business unit level.

The coordinated examination applies procedures sufficient to comprise a full scope financial examination of each of the companies in accordance with the examination procedures and standards promulgated by the NAIC and by the respective state insurance departments where the companies are domiciled. The objective is to enable each domestic state to report on their

respective companies' financial condition and to summarize key results of examination procedures.

The Nebraska Department of Insurance made a general review was made of the Company's operations and the manner in which its business has been conducted in order to determine compliance with statutory and charter provisions. The Company's history was traced and has been set out in this report under the caption "Description of Company." All items pertaining to management and control were reviewed, including provisions for disclosure of conflicts of interest to the Board of Directors and the departmental organization of the Company. The Articles of Incorporation and By-Laws were reviewed, including appropriate filings of any changes or amendments thereto. The minutes of the meetings of the Shareholder, Board of Directors, and committees held during the examination period were read and noted. Attendance at meetings, proxy information, election of Directors and Officers, approval of investment transactions, and authorizations of salaries were also noted.

The fidelity bond and other insurance coverages protecting the Company's property and interests were reviewed. Certificates of Authority to conduct the business of insurance in the various states were inspected, and a survey was made of the Company's general plan of operation.

Data reflecting the Company's growth during the period under review, as developed from the Company's filed annual statements, is reflected in the financial section of this report under the caption "Body of Report."

The Company's reinsurance facilities were ascertained and noted and have been commented upon in this report under the caption "Reinsurance." Accounting records and procedures were tested to the extent deemed necessary through the risk-focused examination

process. The Company's method of claims handling and procedures pertaining to the adjustment and payment of incurred losses were also noted.

All accounts and activities of the Company were considered in accordance with the risk-focused examination process. This included a review of workpapers prepared by Deloitte & Touche, LLP, the Company's external auditors, during their audit of the Company's accounts for the years ended December 31, 2021 and 2022. Portions of the auditor's workpapers have been incorporated into the workpapers of the examiners and have been utilized in determining the scope and areas of emphasis in conducting the examination. This utilization was performed pursuant to Title 210 (Rules of the Nebraska Department of Insurance), Chapter 56, Section 013.

Any failure of items to add to the totals shown in schedules and exhibits appearing throughout this report is due to rounding.

DESCRIPTION OF COMPANY

HISTORY

The Company was originally named Omaha Life Insurance Company and was incorporated in the State of Nebraska in November 2006 as a wholly-owned subsidiary of United. The Certificate of Authority was amended from a life insurance company to a property and casualty insurance company on October 1, 2017. Also, effective October 1, 2017, the Company's name was changed to Property and Casualty Company of Omaha. Effective October 17, 2018, the Company's name was changed to Medicare Advantage Insurance Company of Omaha.

Shareholder

Article III of the Company's Articles of Incorporation states that, "the aggregate number of shares which the Corporation shall have authority to issue is two million (2,000,000) shares of common stock with a par value of each of said shares to be one dollar (\$1.00)." As of December 31, 2022, the Company records indicated that 2,000,000 shares were issued and outstanding, all of which were owned by United.

Article I, Section 1 of the Company's By-Laws states that, "the Shareholders shall meet annually on or before the 30th day of June in each and every calendar year, for the purpose of receiving the report of its Officers and Directors, to elect Directors whose terms expire, and to transact such other business as may be lawful for it to do."

Board of Directors

Article II, Section 1 of the Company's By-Laws states that, "the Board of Directors shall consist of not less than five Directors nor more than nine. At least one of the Directors shall be a resident of Nebraska. The Board of Directors shall be elected at the annual meeting of the Shareholders by a majority vote of the stock represented in person or by proxy at the meeting for a term of one year each. The Directors shall hold office until their successors are elected and qualified." Article III, Section 1 of the Company's By-Laws states that, "the annual meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held immediately following the adjournment of the annual meeting of the Shareholders or as soon thereafter as practicable."

TRANSACTIONS WITH AFFILIATES

Intercompany Services Agreement

Effective February 25, 2019, the Company entered into an intercompany services agreement with its ultimate parent, Mutual, and affiliate, MOMAC. Under the agreement, the Company and other participants will provide to each other certain services such as human resources, finance, accounting, payroll, treasury, investments, information technology, and other areas of expertise such as legal, compliance, internal audit, corporate services, and marketing as needed from time to time. The standards for allocating expenses are for services rendered, on a fair and reasonable basis, resulting in overall equity to the parties.

Tax Allocation Agreement

A consolidated federal income tax return is filed for Mutual and its eligible subsidiaries pursuant to a written agreement approved by the Board of Directors. Each company's provision for federal income tax expense is based on separate return calculations with credit for operating losses allowed by the parent company only as each company would utilize such losses on a separate return basis with limited exceptions.

Capital Contributions

The Company received three capital contributions from its parent, United, over the examination period for a total of \$35,000,000. The Company received \$5,000,000 on January 28, 2019, and two installments of \$15,000,000 on October 30, 2019, and December 26, 2019.

The Company made one return of capital payment to its parent, United, during the exam period. The Company paid a \$3,700,000 extraordinary cash distribution on December 27, 2022.

TERRITORY AND PLAN OF OPERATION

As evidenced by current or continuous Certificates of Authority, the Company is licensed to transact business in Colorado, Nebraska, South Carolina, Texas, and Wisconsin.

The Company was approved with the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services and provided Medicare Advantage insurance products to Medicare-eligible individuals. The Company exited the Medicare market at the end of 2020. The Company's property and casualty business activity includes the runoff of assumed reinsurance contracts.
